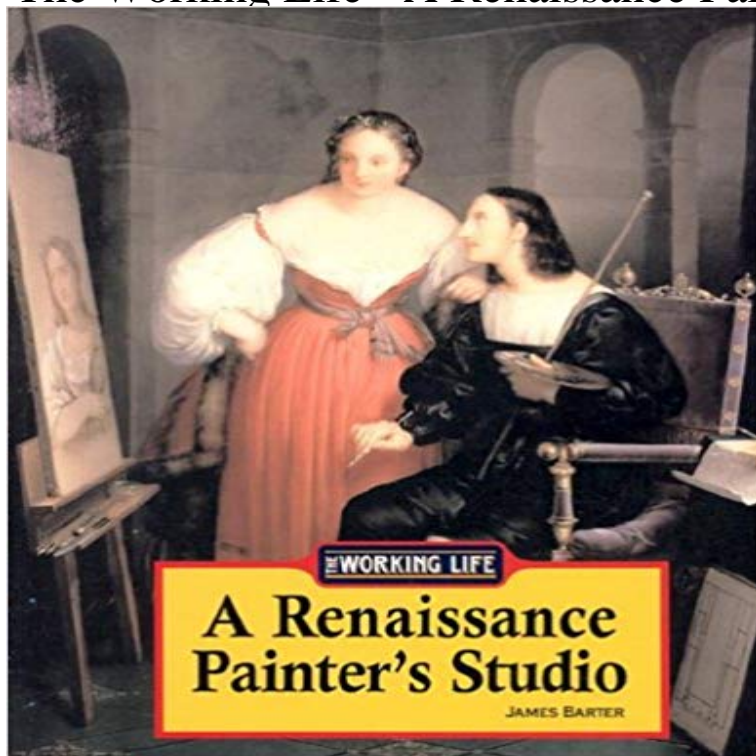


The Working Life - A Renaissance Painters Studio
