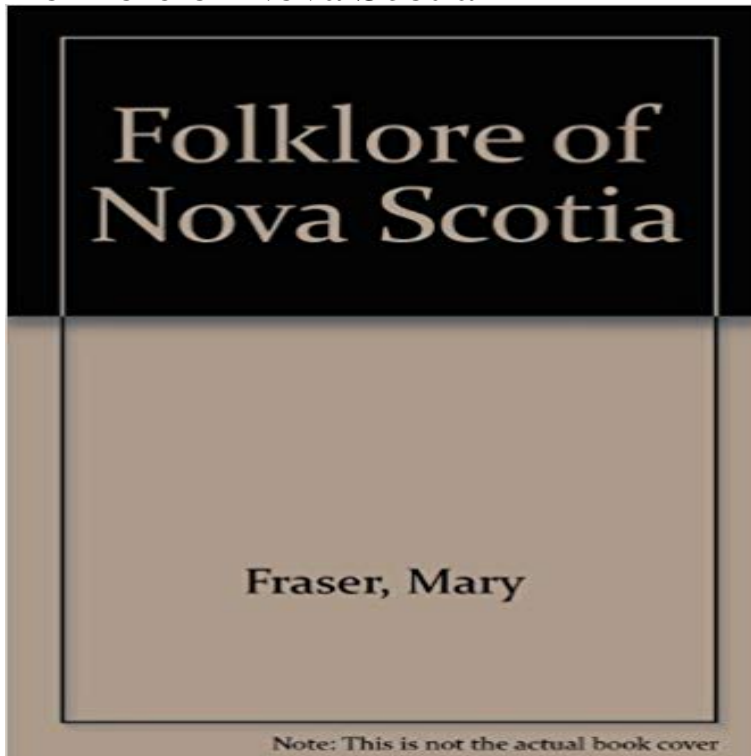


Folklore of Nova Scotia
