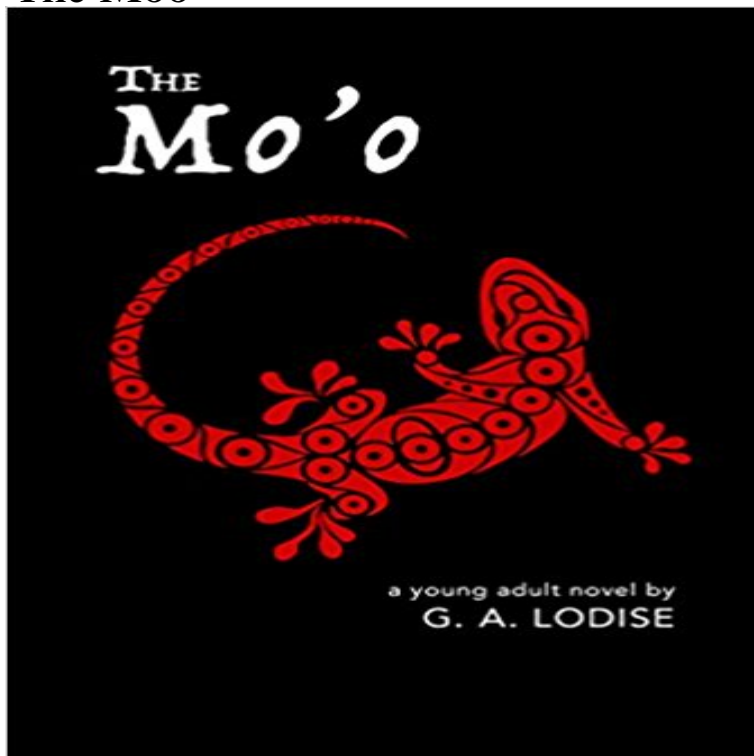


The Moo
