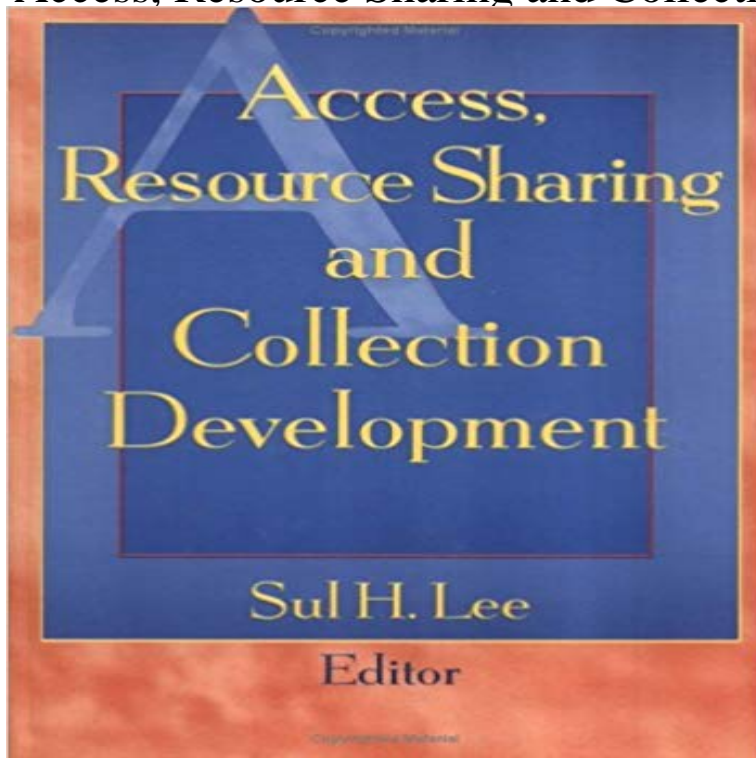


Access, Resource Sharing and Collection Development
