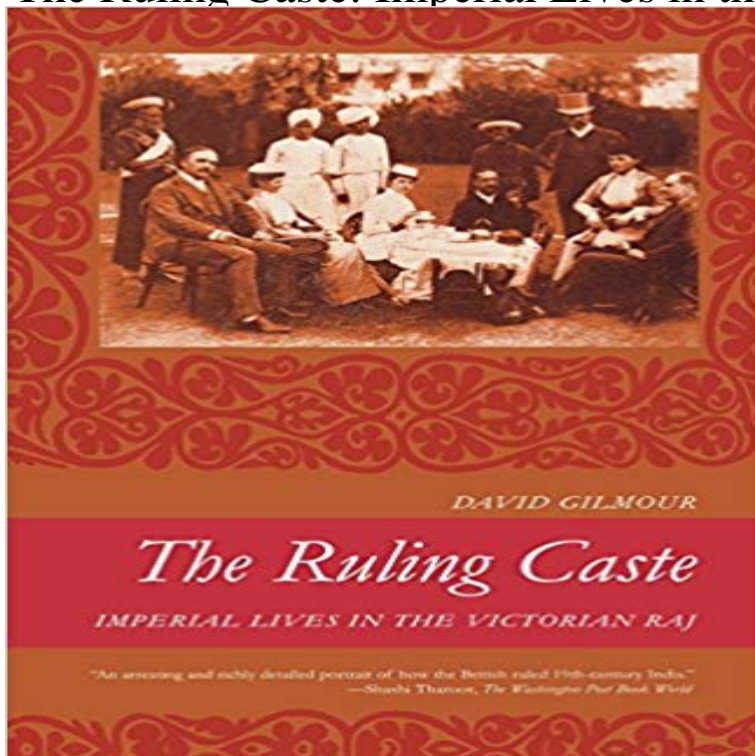


The Ruling Caste: Imperial Lives in the Victorian Raj
