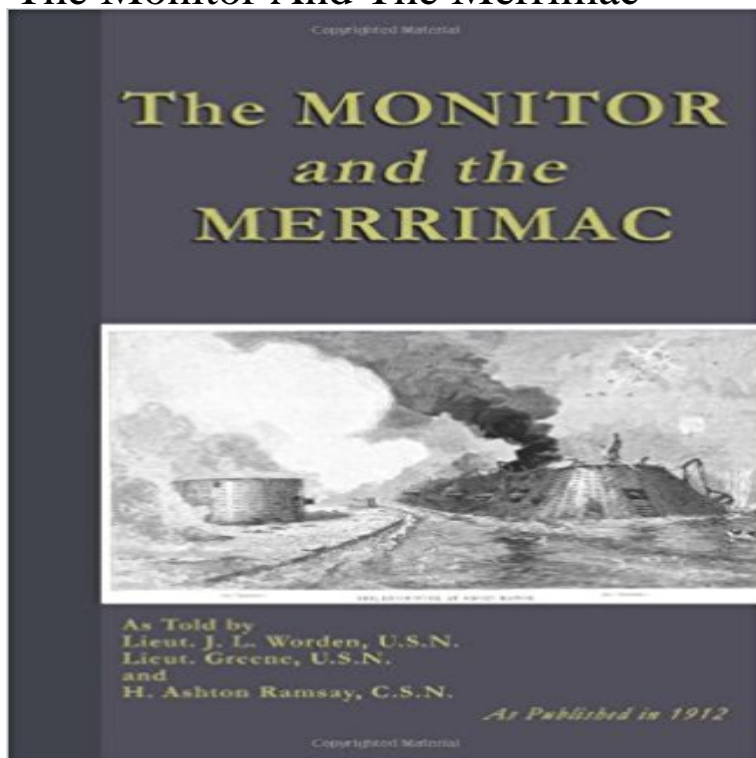


The Monitor And The Merrimac
